

The Department of Justice's NMVTIS database keeps a history of Brands that have been applied to the VIN by any state. RigDig[®] pulls from this database and presents all current or previous brands for a VIN identified. As a consumer, this Brand information helps protect you from purchasing a damaged vehicle that is presented for sale without disclosure of the vehicle's real condition. In addition, it can identify Title Washing schemes where the physical title has been altered to wash the brand, making it appear as though it is a clean title.

One of RigDig's information sources is the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). RigDig reports the information as it is reported to RigDig by FMCSA. If you find any discrepancies in the information, please use the following methods to update the FMCSA source.

Information

Motor Carrier All motor carriers operating commercial motor vehicles in interstate commerce are required to file an updated form MCS-150 (Motor Carrier Identification report) every 2 years. Click here to update your MCS-150.

Accident & Inspection Records

Click here to dispute an accident or inspection record using the DataQs system. The DataQs system is an electronic means for filing concerns about Federal and State data released to the public by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). Through this system, data concerns are automatically forwarded to the appropriate office for resolution. The system also allows filers to monitor the status of each filing.
